The Case history may take 15 minutes to 30 minutes before the Speech Therapist starts to testing the child. The more information the parent is able to give the therapist during this 30 minute session, the better the diagnosis will be.

The initial differential diagnosis depends on the patient's age, gender, and comorbid illnesses. However, nephrolithiasis, pyelonephritis, and musculoskeletal strain account for most cases. A careful history often suggests one of these possibilities or raises suspicion for a less common cause.
